There is a stream of water called Little Cateraque running through the 15th 16th and 17th lots of the second concession and navigable nearly through it and of such size that large rafts of timber are yearly taken by it to the river the sides of this stream are very marshy and abound in flags and marsh hay, and is a great resort for ducks, snipe, woodcock, &c. Likewise a Race of Muskrate have settled near the borders of this stream and like many of the people of this Township notwithstanding the many improvements in the arts of civilization continue their ancient mode of building and erect innumerable mud cabins having nothing more in view than their own comfort to which they are well adapted for notwithstanding the inclemency of the winter and the great depth of ice yet the water never freezes in their cellars. They can at any time pass through for the purposes of feeding and bathing in any part of the stream.

On the mile square Western addition is the outlet of another small stream of water on which are the extensive mills of Anthony McGinn Esq. the course of this stream from the outlet is about north east passing through the mile square into the Township in the third concession

There is a small lake called Mud Lake in the rear of the Western addition, this lake is on a stream of water which runs through Portland thence to Mill Creek on the Kingston and Papaneel Macdonald road the outlet of which is at a place called Floating Bridge within a few miles of Bath. Rafts of saw logs have been taken from Portland to Mill Creek on this stream

This Enumeration district is mostly level and productive where it has been rightly tilled with the exception of some parts of the Western addition which is shrubby and of light soil and is unfit for Agricultural purposes it has been named "Hard Scrabble" the applicability of which is proved by the Agricultural Census
