		<p>say they were idle but their Capital (that is their Labour) is not economically expended in other words however capable they may be to labour for profit under other a number of them are not not qualified to labour with advantage for themselves</p> <p>I have said that the Lands on the front part of the first three are the best in the Township they were of course were first settled and the Farmers on these lands are the most Wealthy in the Township in the year 1836 they commenced a circulating Library which numbers now about 500 volumes and for a number of years past they have been the principal support of a Branch Agricultural Society, but in no part of the Township is there like what an old Country Farmer would call good farming. Draining is got in its infancy and a regular Rotation of Crops is but little known, but it must be had in mind that the population of the Township is composed principally of Emigrants from the Mother Country and that they brought with them the Sabouring class and that they brought nothing into the Township but Stout Hearts and strong arms many of them have paid for their lands and are in comfortable circumstances at least in much better than they remained in the Mother Country, but the man who without any Capital to begin with pays one hundred pounds for one hundred acres of Land in seven or eight years besides supporting a family is under the necessity of placing himself in a position that he can make but little little of his farm for a number of years afterwards Necessity compels him to crop his Land for too too heavily at first, and he cannot make a sufficient of manure to bring it into heart again, ten years and perseverance however will accomplish much</p> <p><u>Education</u></p> <p>Although the Education of youth is of the highest highest importance not only individually but to the the Community at large I am sorry to say that in in this Township it is but little attended to</p> <p>There is scarcely a schoolhouse in the Township that is fit to teach in, and it follows as a matter of course that every indifferent class class of Teachers is employed I think if the people had the means they would Educate their their children but parents that are not able</p> <p>Observations continued on sheet No 4</p>
