<p>There is a stone first mill in this township on the Scotch River near the south west corner of the township. It is three stories in height with four pairs of stones for grinding of grain and a gate for it contains an Oct. mill it can do pretty good business in the winter season and is easily worked requiring two men to tend the same and keep it in operation Peter McSweeney Esq. built this mill and he carries it on.</p> <p>The building of this mill and mill dam and Machinery could not have cost less than from \$2000 to \$2500 - I cannot ascertain the exact profits of this mill.</p> <p>There is a small saw mill in the woods on Sparty Creek near West Hawkesbury line on the east side of this township, it is owned by G. J. Lighthall Esq. of West Hawkesbury. Has but one saw and saw very little business.</p>	40	<p>The Township of Caledonia is bounded on the north by the Township of Longueuil, on the east by the townships of West Hawkesbury, on the south by the townships of Renyon in the County of Renyon and on the west by the townships of Alfred and South Plantagenet.</p> <p>It is watered by Caledonia Creek, Oxyton Creek, and Horse Creek which runs into the townships of Alfred and South Plantagenet.</p> <p>1. The South Petition River, as do the other two creeks first mentioned empty into the same River. The party Creek is on the eastern side of the township and crosses the line and runs through west Hawkesbury to the Ottawa River. On this creek is a small saw mill in Caledonia. The Scotch River is called Cottes the south west corner of the township and empties into the South Petition River in south Plantagenet.</p> <p>On this River in Caledonia stands a stone first mill belonging to Peter McSweeney Esq. In regard to the nature of the soil generally sandy and cold soil - it embraces on the north for several miles the great Caledonia Marsh which pervades three or four townships and is of great value as tract in this township called the Caledonia Tracts, through which runs Caledonia Creek is well settled and the soil is of a superior quality.</p> <p>There is a bridge so called, crossing this township on a direct course S. 10 W. & E. the soil of this lay of land is a sandy loam and produces middling crops.</p> <p>There is a Road lead from west Hawkesbury to the Caledonia Springs and crosses the first Conception. There is a Road, now a first Road leading from Westbank Hill south westerly through this township to the Scotch River and onward to the High Falls on the South Petition River.</p> <p>It is here worthy of remark that the celebrated Caledonia Springs are in the first Conception of this Township.</p>
