- 63 Stone bridge from Hull to Ottawa just below the falls.
- 62 Good wooden bridge and Grist Mill.
- 61 Bad wooden bridge.
- 60 Good wooden bridge.
- 59 Intended site of wooden bridge, the river is very rapid above this.
- 58 Good wooden bridge, stream not fordable close to the road.
- 57 Very bad wooden bridge, stream not fordable close to the road.
- 56 Gatineau River, a large stream having no bridge over it, it runs in a succession of rapids for about 8 Miles and then is navigable for a long way. A large Turry boat runs from here to Ottawa every half hour.
- 55 Bad wooden bridge.

54 Good wooden bridge, stream not fordable from a point half a Mile above the road to its mouth.

53 Good wooden bridge, stream 20 yards across and not fordable.

52 Bad wooden bridge.

51 Very small Village (St. Ange Garden)

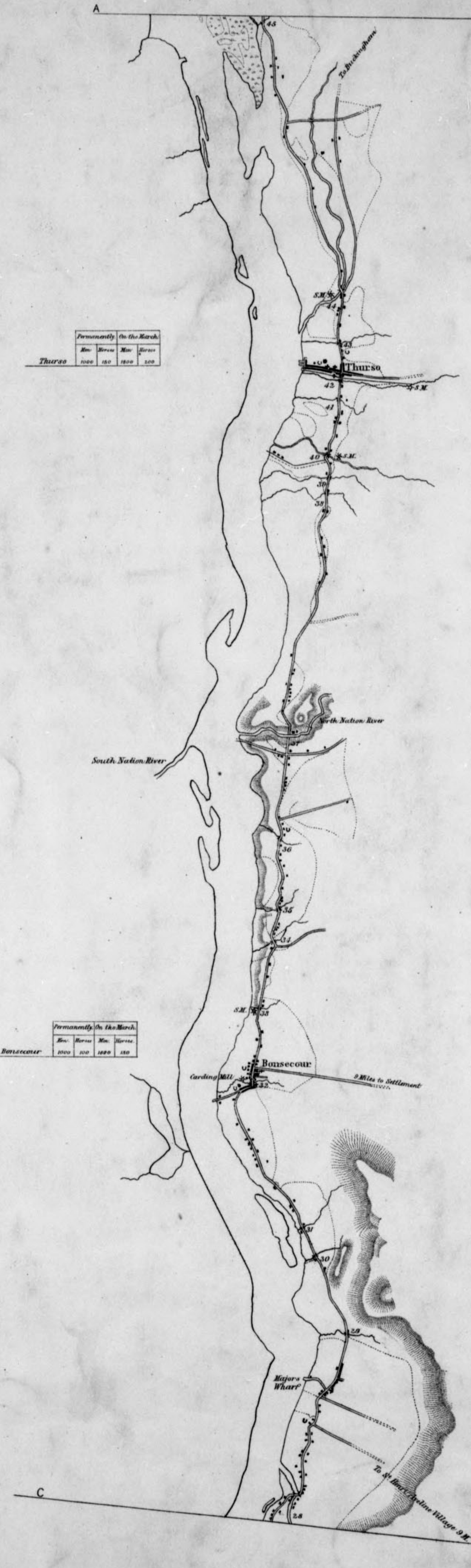
50 Bad wooden bridge.

49 Bad wooden bridge.

48 Good wooden bridge over deep gully.

47 Buckingham, a small town at the falls of the River Liere, has very large Saw Mills, a great lumbering station, large numbers of boats and about 100 teams of horses and men with bush waggons are always to be found in it, the first bridge over the river is here.

40 Bad wooden bridge, stream fordable only when the water is very low.

39 Good wooden bridge.

38 Bad wooden bridge.

37 North Nottaw River, there is no bridge over it, its banks are high and the water is deep enough for small steamers to pass up to the falls.

35 Good wooden bridge.

34 Good wooden bridge.

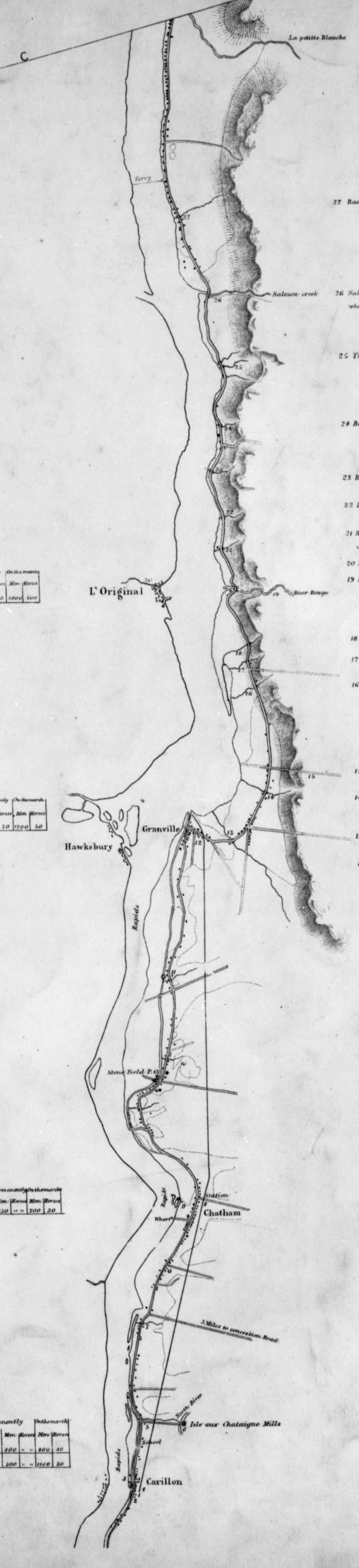
33 Good wooden bridge.

32 Good wooden bridge, strong stone Arch in the village.

31 Good wooden bridge.

28 In petite Roche wooden bridge not in good order. Stream not fordable.

27 Bad wooden bridge.

26 Salmon creek, good wooden bridge 30 x 20 ft. Stream not fordable when water is at all high.

25 Three small streams with bad wooden bridges.

24 Bad wooden bridge.

23 Bad wooden bridge.

22 Bad wooden bridge.

21 Bad wooden bridge, from here the road is not well made and would be very bad in wet weather.

20 L'Original County Town, with strong stone.

19 River Range, Good wooden bridge, 25 x 15 ft. River is fordable about a mile above the bridge, but no where else in the neighborhood.

18 Bad wooden bridge.

17 Good wooden bridge.

16 Good wooden bridge.

15 Scarcely settled, for about 4 miles back. Hills are covered with soft wood.

14 Good wooden bridge.

13 Stream not fordable near road when the water is high, a bad wooden bridge. Saw and grist mills 1/2 miles and saw mill 1 mile up stream.

12 Granville Village. The river is navigable for large vessels from here to Ottawa. The small boats No 2, 3, 4, 5 are here. Steamers from Ottawa to Granville every day. Hawkbury on the south side of river has large saw mills.

11 Good wooden bridge, grist and Saw Mills. Land not cleared on south side of river.

10 Good wooden bridge.

9 A Lock and trap hold stone house, there is one at every system of Locks.

8 Chatham Village. The two Churches are built strongly of stone.

7 Good wooden bridge.

6 Like one Chatham Mills about 1 mile to right of Road are Grist, Saw, and Cloth mills.

5 Good wooden bridge over Millrace.

4 Granville & Carillon Railway, road in good order and having 10 Cars & 2 Locomotives on the line.

3 Military canal, a small dip to pass up to Granville having 11 Locks, the smallest namely No 3, 4, 5 are 20 x 15 ft. over 10 ft. the rest narrow.

2 A house built for Bartrache would hold about 200 men.

1 Carillon, small village at the south end of the 640 ft. dam of Lower end of rapids which extend up the river about 1/2 mile. The steamer from Montreal touches here every day.
